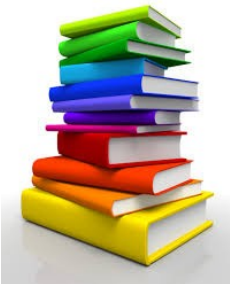

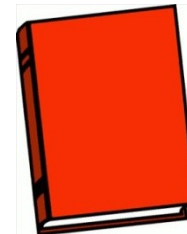

# Matthew

- A disciple (Levi), a tax collector
- Written to the Jews
- Genealogy (Legal descendent of King David, and heir to the throne)
- Jesus is the **promised Messiah** (the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies)
- Jesus is **rightful king** (from birth to death)
- The Kingdom

**“She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins.” (1: 21)**



# Mark

- John Mark (John Jewish name, Mark Roman name)
- Companion of Peter (Acts 12:12, 1 Peter 5:13)
- Written to non-jews (Romans)
- No genealogy
- Jesus – the servant
  - The servant's service 1-10
  - The servant's sacrifice 11-16

**“For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many” (10: 45)**



# Luke

- Gentile (Physician)
- Written to non-jews (Gentile Greek believers)
- Genealogy
- Jesus - the son of man
- Emphasizes Christ's humanity (hunger, thirst, tired)
  - Introduction of the Son of Man ( 1: 1 to 4:13)
  - The Ministry of the Son of Man (4:14 – 9:50)
  - The Rejection of the Son of Man (9:51 – 19:27)
  - The Crucifixion and Resurrection of the son of Man (19:28-24:53)

**“For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost.” (19: 10)**



# John

- Disciple
- Written to new Christians
- 7 Miracles, 7 I AM's, Believe about 100 times
- No Genealogy
- Jesus - the Son of God - Christ's Deity
  - The Incarnation of the Son of God (1:1-18)
  - The Presentation of the Son of God (1:19 – 4:54)
  - The Opposition to the Son of God (5:1 – 12:50)
  - The preparation of the Disciples by the Son of God (13:1 – 17:26).
  - The Crucifixion and Resurrection of the Son of God (18:1 – 21:25).

**“These are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name” (John 20:31).**



# Acts

- Church History – Luke the Physician
- Jesus ascension, 120 believers, Day of Pentecost, birth of the Church, 3000 believed, added to the Church
- Jesus' commissioned us, the Holy Spirit Empowers us
- Opposition, Persecution, Explosive Growth of the Church
- The Gospel from Jerusalem to Rome
  - Witness in Jerusalem (1:1 – 8:4)
  - Witness in Judea and Samaria (8:5 – 12:25)
  - Witness to the Uttermost part of the World (chapter 13 -28)

**But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” (1: 8)**
